Lady Vikes gun for third straight MVL title

FLINTON - Two consecutive Moshannon Valley League championships should automatically make the Glendale High School girls basketball team preseason favorites. Still, head coach Andy Bloom isn't assuming anything.

The Lady Vikings lost three of their top five scorers to graduation from last year's 14-9 squad. That team, despite the winning record, did not enter the District 6 class A playoffs, so that will be on the team's agenda this season as six returning letter winners lead Bloom's squad.

"Last year, I wanted to know from them what they felt and did they really want to go to the playoffs," said Bloom, in his eighth season overall and fourth in his second stint. "The consensus appeared to be that they didn't want to go and we didn't go. There isn't a purpose of going if you don't think you can achieve success."

"Hopefully this season, it'll be a different story. We want to get better as the season progresses."

The Lady Vikings failed to have a player average double figures in scoring last year, and that could be the case again this year as a squad deep in talent will promote offense by committee.

Junior Angie Frisco, a two-year letter winner, will move to the point guard position and run the offense. She led the team with a 9.3 scoring average as a sophomore. The other returning starter is senior guard

Angie Kauffman. As a defensive specialist, she averaged 5.1 points per game last season.

Other returning letter winners include senior Renee Smyers and juniors Lori Beers, Bernadette Depto and Missy Gondek.

Who starts the game may be trivial in the scheme of things for Bloom, who likes his team's size and speed. The Lady Vikings could go as deep as 11 players, depending on the game situation.

"We have a lot of kids who can play," Bloom said. "There isn't one kid on the roster that doesn't have the ability. The problem is the experience factor. If we get things together and realize what is important - teamwork and hard work - we'll be alright."

The size of Glendale's forwards could present problems for opponents. Gondek and Depto go 5-10 while junior Bobbi Jo O'Shell stands 5-8 and junior Nichole Heitsenrether towers at 6-2.

"We have a pretty big lineup, especially in the forward spots. Whether we use that or not is another situation," Bloom said.

However, don't expect the Lady Vikes to rely on the power game inside. They will use a lineup combination that will specialize on the defensive pressure that has separated them from the rest of the MVL pack in past seasons.

"We do have good speed overall and there are certain lineups with which we can press with," Bloom said. "I see us using more half-court zone presses this year with the lineup we have."

Along with Frisco and Kauffman, other guards to see action include Smyers, Beers, junior Beth O'Donnell, sophomore Buffy Dick and back-up point guard, sophomore Tammy O'Shell. A third guard should be a familiar combination in the Lady Vikes' starting five.

Bloom's assistant coach this year is Rick Feigh.

The Lady Vikings, who play in the Juniata Valley League as well, open the season at home Thursday night against MVL rival Harmony.

Lady Vikes take defensive battle. 39-32

FLINTON - If last night's opener between Glendale and Harmony is any indication of how the season will shape up in the Moshannon Valley League, break out the band aids and antiseptic.

The Lady Vikings and Lady Owls hooked up in a knock down, drag out defensive struggle that Glendale won 39-32 last night at Glendale High School.

"No lack of heart on our part," Harmony head coach Eileen Adamo said. "Just such a defensive, physical game. That was as defensive as it's going to get."

The teams combined for 46 fouls, 29 turnovers and 19 steals. Much of this lack of fundamentals could be blamed on inexperience as only one senior (Angie Kauffman of Glendale) started.

"A typical first game," Glendale head coach Andy Bloom said. "A lot of turnovers and a lot of missed opportunities by both teams. Both teams hustled hard, but it was obviously the first game. I'm sure both of us will get better as the season goes on."

Both teams took some time

getting the rust off as only two field goals were scored in the entire first quarter.

Junior Amber Gregg put the Lady Owls on the board first when she drained a jumper from 17 feet. Gregg finished with a team-high 12 points, shooting 10-12 from the foul line.

"Amber Gregg hit so many of them tonight," Adamo said. "She held us on the foul line with her points, kept us on the scoreboard."

The teams traded free throws until Glendale junior Missy Gondek laid in a rebound with two seconds left in the quarter to give the Lady Vikes a 6-5 advantage.

The Lady Vikes opened up their biggest lead at the two minute mark of the second quarter at 17-12 when Angie Frisco hit a jumper. Frisco led all scorers with 13 points on the evening. Glendale went into the lockerroom with a 19-16 lead.

The third quarter saw Harmony lose its leading scorer from last season, Valerie Fry, to an injury to her right ankle. Adamo said Fry was being taken to the hospital for x-rays and her condition was unknown.

Harmony was able to cut the

Lady Vikes lead to two throughout the third and fourth quarters but could get no closer because of its inability to convert foul shots. The Lady Owls were just 2-of-6 down the stretch.

Meanwhile, the Lady Vikes were able to convert their free throws (8-12) in the second half, enabling them to hold on for the victory.

"I guess it was the first time before crowds for some of these guys," Bloom said. "Sometimes it's a little tough for both of teams to get into it because they can't hear what they want to, just little things get them excited."

In the jayvee contest, the Lady Vikes downed Harmony 49-13. Amy Davis led the way for Glendale with 12, Nikki Straw led the Lady Owls with eight.

Both teams return to action Monday with Glendale hosting West Branch and Harmony traveling to Purchase Line.

HYDE - It was a long night of girls' basketball at Arthur J. Weiss Gymnasium.

Visiting Glendale came to town looking for a win against a Clearfield team looking to get its star a milestone. After the smoke cleared in the foul and turnover filled contest, both teams reached those goals.

The Lady Vikings won their fifth straight game to start the season in a 50-30 victory over the Lady Bisons and Clearfield senior Heather Jacobs, who came into the game with 984 points, reached the 1,000-point milestone on a foul shot with 2:02 remaining.

Still, the victory that eluded the Lady Bisons was cause for some concern for head coach Wayne Wood, whose team dropped to 3-4.

third quarter and that was the key."

Glendale tops Damsels; captures third straight Mo Valley League title

FLINTON - "This hurts like hell."

The words of Moshannon Valley head coach Mick Patkalitsky tells the whole story. His Damsels went toe-to-toe with backyard rival Glendale for the third time this season, this meeting to break the 7-1 tie atop the Moshannon Valley League and decide the league championship.

Early on, it looked like it would be a walk in the park for Glendale. After jumping out to an 11-7 lead after the first quarter, the Lady Vikes put on their shooting shoes.

After Mo Valley's Angie Fleming laid one in to cut the deficit to two, Glendale went on a 14-3 run to take a 25-12 lead at the half. Angie Frisco was the big gun for the Lady Vikes, scoring 10 of her team's 14 points in the second quarter.

Coming out of the locker room, the Damsels offense awoke. A jumper from Adrienne Speerstra and a trey from Holly Kephart forced Glendale to burn a time out just 1:03 into the third quarter.

"The changes did not come from the coach, the changes came from the kids," Patkalitsky said. "There were no adjustments made. There was a wakeup call at halftime from the coach but in a game like this, if you need a wakeup call from the coach at halftime I don't know how successful you're going to be at the end."

Whatever Patkalitsky said in the locker room worked as his Damsels cut the Glendale lead to seven, 30-23, to end the third quarter.

The fourth quarter was like the two other Glendale-Mo Valley meetings condensed into eight minutes. It was going to come down to the final seconds.

Mo Valley (12-11, 7-2) started strong. Two free throws from Kristin Ricciotti and a short jumper from Speerstra cut the lead to three, 30-27, with five minutes remaining.

Speerstra then did the job on the defensive end by stepping into the passing lane and going the distance for a layup that cut it to one with 4:20 to go.

Whenever the Lady Vikes needed a shot in the arm, Frisco was the one delivering. She followed Speerstra's layup with a three-pointer from the right side to rebuild the lead back to four with three minutes standing between her team and the league championship. So, too, were the Damsels.

Colleen Houser's two free throws brought Mo Valley within two yet again. With two minutes to go, Bernadette Dep-to's layin increased the Glendale lead back to four, 35-31.

As the seconds ticked off, Mo Valley saw its championship hopes beginning to fade but it didn't quit. With 42 seconds remaining, Speerstra took the in-bounds pass and laid it in to move within two at 35-33.

Thirty-nine seconds later, Glendale got the biggest free throw of the season when Lori Beers stepped up and hit the front end of a one-and-one to

give the Lady Vikes a 36-33 lead.

Beers, who had four fouls, then committed her smartest foul of the season with a tick left on the clock when she grabbed Houser to send her to the line.

"It was just the excitement of the game," Bloom said of Beers' foul. "Everybody was pumped ... it worked out OK."

Houser made both shots, despite trying desperately to miss the second one. The Lady Vikes inbounded the ball and had their third championship in a row.

The Lady Vikes don't have much time to rest on their laurels as they enter the District 6 playoffs today against Homer-Center. Tip-off is scheduled for 4:30 p.m. at Purchase Line High School.

Moshannon Valley takes on Purchase Line Monday at Central Cambria High School in Ebensburg with the tip-off slated for 7 p.m.

Lady Vikes come up short against Homer, 48-47

PURCHASE LINE - What a way to end the season.

Playing its fourth game in six days, the Glendale girls' basketball team opened the District 6 Class A playoffs Saturday afternoon, less than 24 hours after clinching its third straight Moshannon Valley League title.

Fatigue may have been a factor but the Lady Vikings still came close in a 48-47 first round loss to Homer-Center at Purchase Line High School. Head coach Andy Bloom's squad finished the season with a 13-10 record.

"We played three tough opponents in as many days and coming off the emotional win over Moshannon Valley (Friday night), I was pleased with their effort," said Bloom. "They played outstanding basketball."

This one went down to the final seconds.

After Glendale grabbed its biggest lead of the afternoon (35-31) in the opening moments of the fourth quarter, the Lady

Wildcats (16-8) went on a 9-0 run and led 42-38 with 4:36 remaining.

Although they never surrendered the lead, the Lady Wildcats had to hold off a last minute rally by Glendale that nearly pushed the game into overtime.

Laura Zoldak's two free throws with 33 seconds left put Homer-Center up 48-43, but back came the Lady Vikes. Angie Kauffman's rebound off Angie Frisco's three-point attempt cut it to 48-45 then following a Homer-Center turnover, Glendale had a chance to tie.

With four seconds left, Frisco's three-point attempt missed but Lady Wildcats' Shannon Bowser was whistled for the foul, putting the Glendale junior on the line for three shots with two seconds on the clock.

Frisco made the first but missed the second. With no time outs left, Bloom wasn't able to set up a planned miss on the third. Frisco made it anyway and the Lady Wildcats escaped with the one-point win.

It was a rough and physical

game throughout as both teams combined for 54 turnovers, Glendale giving it away 28 times. Four players fouled out of the game, three of them Homer-Center starters Beth Buzi, Katrina Albright and Bowser. Buzi led Homer-Center with 14 points.

Frisco and Lori Beers, who fouled out midway through the fourth quarter, each scored 16 points to pace the Lady Vikings. In all, Glendale was 8-of-29 from the three-point line with Beers and Frisco each sinking four.

"We did a great job defensively; we've done that all season," Bloom said. "Any problems we've had have come offensively, scoring points not giving them up."

Homer-Center advances to the semifinal round and will face defending state champion Bishop Guilfoyle Wednesday night at Hollidaysburg Junior High School. Tip-off is slated for 5:30 p.m.

The Lady Vikes now look to next year with the bulk of their team returning, with only Kauffman graduating. Seven will re-

turn next season as seniors, four of them starters including Frisco, the Lady Vikes' leading scorer. Glendale will attempt to become the first team to four-peat in the MVL.

"We come back with seven seniors next year and all of them have ability," Bloom said. "I think we're going to be pretty strong if the kids stick with it and work hard over the summer."
