# Same old story:

# Lady Vikings out to win fourth straight MVL title

FLINTON - It's a different year, but the expectations are the same for the Glendale girls' basketball team.

Once again the Lady Vikings enter the season as defending Moshannon Valley League champions. And once again they are the preseason favorites.

With nine letter winners returning from last year's 14-10 squad, expectations are high for the Lady Vikings as they go after their unprecedented fourth straight league title.

"This is a very good group," Glendale head coach Andy Bloom said. "They're really doing some good stuff. We've improved quite a bit from last year. This group - but of course there were other good players involved down the line has got a nice opportunity."

Leading the group of re-turning letter winners are seniors Angie Frisco and Ber-

nadette Depto.

Frisco, a three-year letter winner, led the Lady Vikings offense last year averaging 13 points per game. The Second Team Progressland All-Star will get the nod at point guard. She has scored 625 career points.

Depto, also a three-year letter winner, gets the nod at center after averaging 7.6 points per game last year.

Joining Frisco at the guard spots are seniors Lori Beers and Beth O'Donnell. Beers, who averaged 7 points per game and led the team with 38 three-pointers last season, is a two-year letter winner. She along with Depto and Frisco were the only Lady Vikings to appear in all 24 games last year. O'Donnell averaged 3.4 points per game last year.

"This is a very good group. We've improved quite a bit from last year." Glendale coach Andy Bloom

"We do have a lot of good guards," Bloom said, "I hope our outside shooting will be more consistent. Toward the later part of last season our outside shooting at guard really came on well, and hopefully that will carry over into this

season. We really need that to open up the inside game."

Filling the other starting spot will be senior forward Missy Gondek, who averaged 4.4 points per game last season.

Don't consider the Lady Vikings' strength ending with the starting five. Seven other players on this year's varsity roster also saw varsity play-

ing time last year.

"We have a lot of depth and some younger kids that can play also," Bloom said. "If somebody gets hurt - hopefully not - we should have somebody that can take their place and we won't lose much."

With the players that are returning and the all that this group has already accom-plished, Bloom is still striving for something that he feels has been missing - consistency. Last year, the Lady Vikings' longest winning streak was five games.

"We still haven't reached that consistency that we need to reach," Bloom said. "These guys have to know by now that if you're not focused, you're not going to be competitive. That's what we must do, and I think they know that.'

Glendale opens the season Friday night at the Clearfield Tip-off Tournament against Philipsburg- Osceola. The MVL season kicks off Dec. 8 when the Lady Vikings host Harmony and the Juniata Valley season begins Dec. 15 at Juniata

"I was pleased with the win," P-O head coach Lee Fisher said. "(But) I thought both teams - there were two very good ball teams out on the floor didn't shoot very well at all, particularly in the first half for us."

Also Lady helping the Mounties was their press, which caused nine Lady Vikings turnovers in the quarter and helped by P-O take an 18-14 lead.
