

New faces hope to carry on winning tradition at Glendale

FLINTON - Fans of Glendale Lady Viking basketball will be in for a different look in the 1995-96 season.

Head coach Andy Bloom plans on using 10 to 12 players, utilizing the full-court press and playing a more up-tempo style

of game.

After a 14-12 campaign where the Lady Vikings advanced to the consolation round of the District 6 Class A playoffs, Bloom must replace seven seniors. Two of those seniors were Angie Frisco and Bernadette Depto, who combined to average 22 points per game. Glendale will also try to win its fifth straight Mo Valley League title.

Bloom has just two returning letterwinners in seniors Beth Dick and Tammy O'Shell. O'Shell averaged 2.5 ppg. and Dick averaged 2.2.

But he's not worried about

replacing players.

"We don't lose anything when we go to the bench with this group," Bloom said. "I'm not afraid to use any of them and I feel very confident in these girls."

The Lady Vikings will open their season in the Clearfield Tip-off Tournament Friday against the Lady Bisons. Philipsburg-Osceola and Du-Bois Central Christian play in the other game. In last year's tourney, P-O topped Glendale 53-31 in the opening round before the Lady Vikings rallied to beat DCC, 71-24, in the consolation game.

Bloom can't remember the last time he had a club without any returning starters. But he does have a team that has

played together.

"These girls played together on the junior varsity for two years and we did pretty well this summer in one of (the) leagues in Altoona," Bloom said. "Our junior class is a very good group and the players are all very equal ability-wise."

Bloom said his team may be taken lightly in the MVL this year, but "that would be a mistake."

The juniors include Mary Jo Rea, Nicole Ruffaner, Amy Davis, Jessica Jenkins, Kelly Vinglass, Melissa Feigh, Candice Dudurich, Jennifer Noel, Stacie Miles, Kristen Morrison.

Bloom in his sixth year at Glendale as a head coach and 10th overall, knows his team has to work on rebounding.

"We want to run and have our defense give us easy chances to score, but we have to have possession of the ball before we can do that," Bloom said.

HYDE - Clearfield High School head girls' basketball coach Pat Pallo had a lot of concerns heading into the season.

Now, he's got another.

Team leader Tracy Honko injured her finger in the second quarter and did not return in the season opener Friday night. Glendale took advantage as it dropped the Lady Bisons, 52-37, in the feature game of the Clearfield Tip-Off Tournament at the Arthur J. Weiss Gymnasium.

The game was even in the first quarter, but momentum started to shift after Honko left the game early in the second.

"She's running the show," said Pallo, whose team will face DuBois Central Christian in the consolation game tonight beginning at 6 p.m. "Losing her was really a test for the girls. I was hoping that we would overcome that."

But the Lady Bisons (0-1) cracked under the pressure of the Glendale defense. The Lady Vikes (1-0) were slow getting out of the gate, but they turned it up a notch in the third quarter and rolled to the win.

Head coach Andy Bloom was pleased to start the season with a win.

"The girls were a little uptight to start the game," said Bloom. "But that was understandable because we didn't have anyone back who started last year. Things came together

for us in the third."

Both offenses struggled early. Glendale took an early 2-0 lead on a bucket by Nichole Ruffaner. A Honko free-throw made it 2-1. That would be the only point she would score in the game.

The lead bounced back-andforth early in the game. Clearfield got its first lead when Maggie Vezza canned a shot from the top of the key to make

Glendale then knotted things at 8-8. That's how the first quarter ended.

Clearfield snagged a 10-8 lead in the second quarter, but Glendale answered on a bucket by Amy Davis.

After the Davis bucket, disaster struck for Clearfield. Honko was injured away from the ball and left the contest with 6;50 to go in the first half.

Glendale responded by opening up a 17-12 lead. But Clear-field fought back and eventually tied it at 18-18 on a three-pointer by Carrie Moore.

"They didn't quit, and I was pleased to see that. I was pleased with the effort, but not the outcome," Pallo said.

Clearfield went to the intermission down, 26-23.

The third quarter proved to be the difference in the game. Glendale came out and went right for the jugular. The Lady Vikes scored the first 14 points of the quarter and opened up a 40-23 lead with 4:04 left in the third.

Tammy O'Shell provided a couple of knockout blows, connecting on two treys in during the 14-0 run. After that, Clearfield was fighting an uphill battle. It didn't get within double digits of the lead.

"I was really pleased to see that (third quarter outburst). The third quarter was the difference in the game. Some things started to click for us," Bloom said.

Glendale outscored the Lady Bisons 18-4 in the third quarter.

Late in the game, Clearfield trimmed the lead to 47-34 when Vezza stole the ball and scored on a lay-in with 2:15 to play in the game. But it was too little, too late.

Vezza led all players in scoring with 17 points. Mary Jo Rea paced Glendale with 13 points, while O'Shell also reached double digits with 10.

Glendale will take on Philipsburg-Osceola in the championship game of the tournament tonight beginning at 7:30 p.m. Although the teams haven't met yet this season, they are familiar with each other.

"We played P-O in a summer league. They're a real disciplined team and they don't make a lot of mistakes, and they're physically strong," said Bloom. "It will be a good challenge."

AMESVILLE - One would think that after winning the Moshannon Valley League for four consecutive seasons, the Glendale Lady Vikings would be ready to take a year off and let another team win the title for a change.

Then again, maybe not.

The Lady Vikes sent a message to the rest of the MVL Friday night: That they are the defending champions, and that they're not going to give things up that easily.

Glendale held off a furious second half Moshannon Valley rally to post a 46-43 win at the Monte Close Gymnasium. The win kept the Lady Vikes unbeaten at 2-0 and in first

place in the MVL.

"I hope this is a sign," said Glendale head coach Andy Bloom, whose squad improved to 5-4 overall. "This is only one game, but I think (the league) is going to be a dogfight."

Friday night's clash certainly was. The Lady Vikes squadered an early first half lead, only to hang on down the stretch. Amy Davis hit a pair of free throws with six seconds left to give Glendale a three-point lead.

Mo Valley's Allison Stodart missed a three-pointer at the buzzer that would have tied the game and sent it into overtime.

It was the second three-point in three days for the Damsels, who slipped to 3-2 in the league and 4-6 overall. If the Damsels are going to get back into the MVL race, they're going to need some help.

"It was a heck of a com-eback," said Mo Valley head coach Mick Patkalitsky, whose team battled back from a 15point first half deficit, "What we're trying to emphasize to the girls right now is that we want to give ourselves the opportunity to win every game. And we're doing that,"
