

FLINTON — Last season, Glendale Lady Viking head basketball coach Andy Bloom decided to call it quits, leaving the door open for first-time head coach Renee McQuown to take over the reigns.

McQuown, who teaches at Glendale, has coached junior varsity and junior high teams at Glendale in the past, but is making her first step into the

varsity level.

She will take over a team that went 12-13 last year and returns just four letterwinners

to the squad.

Senior Nikki Keith and juniors, Amanda Corson, Jean Kaufman and Jill Miles return to the Lady Vikings this season and will be Glendale's starting five, along with senior Kristin Keith.

Those returning five will be joined by 12 other players, including 10 freshmen this sea-

son.

With so many players on her roster, McQuown will be emphasizing team unity for the 2000

season.

"These girls are used to playing with only seven or eight players on the team," McQuown said. "A lot of them are used to playing the whole game without someone to substitute for them, so it's going to be really different this year. That's why we want to make playing as a team a priority. Basketball is a team sport, not just for one player."

Glendale will have to play as a team if they want to successfully replace Elecia Kruise, whom the Lady Vikes lost to graduation after last season.

"These girls are used to playing with only seven or eight players on the team," McQuown said. "A lot of them are used to playing the whole game without someone to substitute for them, so it's going to be really different this year. That's why we want to make playing as a team a priority. Basketball is a team sport, not just for one player."

Glendale will have to play as a team if they want to successfully replace Elecia Kruise, whom the Lady Vikes lost to graduation after last season.

Kruise became Glendale High School's leading scorer with 1,418 points, breaking the old record of 1,243 points by Sherri (Frisco) Campbell. The former Lady Viking guard, who is now playing basketball at Lafayette, averaged 22.1 points per game last year, while tallying a total of 531 points.

Glendale also must replace Lyncola Sinclair, who averaged 3.9 points per game for the Lady

Vikings last year.

With those two seniors gone and just two seniors this year, McQuown will look to her letterwinners and Kristin Keith to lead her team this year.

"We are definitely looking for those five to step up this year,"

McQuown said. "But everyone knows that this year they will all have to put their best foot forward and step up."

With two scrimmages behind them, McQuown thinks that her team is on its way to being suc-

cessful.

"We had some scrimmages


and the girls played well," she said. "They just needed some confidence and needed to know that they can do this without Elecia. We are pretty small height-wise, but I think that we will do well."

With tough opponents in the Moshannon Valley and Juniata Valley Leagues, McQuown's crew is looking forward to games with rivals Moshannon Valley (Dec. 15 and Jan. 26) and Harmony (Dec. 18 and Feb. 14).

"We want to continue to do well in the Mo Valley League," said McQuown. "We are going to continue with Coach Bloom's program, because it will be easier for me to learn those plays than for them to learn mine. We have brought some new things in though."

The Lady Vikes will begin their season on Friday when they travel to the Cambria Heights tournament to face off against host Cambria Heights, Bellefonte

and Northern Bedford.

Miles leads Lady Vikings past Lady Warriors

ALLPORT — The Glendale Lady Vikings were without sen-ior starters Nikki and Kristen Keith in their game against West Branch Monday night, but as it turns out they didn't really need them.

Glendale's Jill Miles scored 32 points, racked up 18 rebounds and stole the ball seven times en route to a 67-21 win over the Lady Warriors at West Branch.

"Jill did an awesome job tonight," said Lady Viking head coach Renee McQuown. "She sets her mind to a goal and she goes after it. She was tops in everything for us tonight. And that proves just what a team leader she is for us. It showed tonight with our two seniors out and having to start two freshman. She really stepped up."

The Lady Vikings started out

early, jumping out to a 9-4 lead early in the first quarter.

That 9-4 lead would turn into a 16-0 run for Glendale that put the Lady Vikes up 25-4 early in the second quarter.
"We just didn't do anything

right tonight," said West Branch head coach Stu Tripler "They were down their two senior starters and they still came out and wanted to play basketball. We didn't play well and we just quit. We thought that we could play with them. But we got down early and we just lacked the mental toughness. It's a shame and it's something that we are going to have to work on. We deserve what we got and they deserve what they got. They played a great game and they hustled."

Glendale controlled the game the rest of the way, racking up 27 second-half points to West Branch's eight.

The Lady Vikings also netted 29 field goals on the night, com-pared to the Lady Warriors'

Mary Buynak and Beth Shimmel led the Lady Warriors

with seven points each.
Lady Viking guard Amanda
Corson finished the night with 20 points, while teammates Jean Kaufman and Kaytee Gates finished with 10 and five points, respectively.
"This was one of our goals,"

said McQuown. "To keep the lead and not look back. We played well on the fast break tonight, and I think that's what gave us the edge. Plus they were making their lay-ups tonight. I think that it gives this team a real boost, especially going into our game against Mo Valley Friday."

West Branch came out on top of the Lady Vikings in the junior varsity game, 26-16. The Lady Warriors were led by Melissa Bosak, who notched 14 points, while Kellie Corman added 10 points on the night.

Crystal Sanders led Glendale with eight points.

West Branch falls to 0-5 on the season. The Lady Warriors travto Bellwood-Antis Thursday.

FLINTON — It looked as if the Moshannon Valley High School girls' basketball team was going to run away with Friday evening's game with Glendale in the fourth quarter. Melissa Reifer hit a jumper 25 seconds into the final stanza to put the Damsels up 35-22.

With their backs to the wall, the Lady Vikings didn't quit and battled back to within three with a 10-0 run over the next five minutes. That's when Mo Valley senior Katie Martin stepped up.

Martin tallied the final 10 outscoring Damsel points, Glendale 10-2 over the final 2:36 as Mo Valley outlasted the Lady Vikings 45-34. Martin finished with a game-high 23 points and six rebounds.

"Katie's a force," said Damsel head coach Brian Pelka. "She's our go-to girl. She hasn't been feeling well and didn't practice the last two days. That's why I didn't start her tonight. I told her if she felt OK, she was going to get in, but I wasn't going to start her and she understood.

.... With the victory, Mo Valley improved to 4-2 overall and 3-1 in the Juniata Valley League. It was the Damsels' first Moshannon Valley League game. Glendale fell to 1-5 overall, 1-1 in the MVL and 1-3 in the JVL.

"I think we are potentially a better team than we showed tonight, but a win is a win and very important, especially in this league," said Pelka. "I'm happy. This is a tough place to play.

"This is a good rivalry," con-tinued Pelka. "Any classic rivalry, whether it's Alabama-Auburn or Pitt-Penn State, you can throw the records out the window. It will be a grudge match.

That's what this game was tonight. We knew it was going to be tooth-and-nail. We showed a lot of character out there."

"We started three juniors and two freshmen," said Lady Viking head coach Renee McQuown. "We lack some experience and it shows. We missed our two seniors (Nikki and Kristin Keith) tonight. I don't think we have anything to be ashamed of. They had a lot of height over us and they took it to the hoop."

Glendale used strong foul shooting to make its comeback. The Lady Vikings were 7-of-10 from the free throw line during their run. Jill Miles, which led Glendale with 19 points, hit six of

the seven foul shots.

"Our foul shots came up short in the first half," said McQuown. "(Foul shooting) is what brought us back in the second half.

"Their foul shooting kept them in the game," said Pelka.

Martin stopped the run with a layup at the 2:36 mark and then added another to extend the Damsels' lead to 39-32 with 1:28 remaining. Miles connected on two free throws to make it a five-point margin with 51 seconds to go, but Martin sealed the a conventional with win three-point play with 16 ticks left on the clock.

"I was saying to myself, 'I can't believe this is happening,"' said Pelka of the Glendale comeback. "It seemed like we had the game under control. We weren't blowing them out, but we had a

pretty decent lead."

"We have goals we set in the locker room for each game," said McQuown. "One of those goals is to never give up. They're determined not to let anything bother them this year and to not get frustrated. When we get frustrated, that's when everything goes to pot. They took it upon themselves that they were going to give it their all and they did.'

The two teams battled back-and-forth in the first quarter. Glenidale led 9-8 at the end of

the first quarter.

Mo Valley used an 8-0 run at the start of the second quarter to take a 16-9 advantage with 3:57 left in the first half. Katie Martin had six of the points during the run.

The Lady Vikings cut the Damsel lead to 16-12 with a bucket from Miles and a free throw from Amanda Corson. Mo Valley responded with a layup from Susan Holencik and a free throw from Brenda Queen to take a 19-12 lead. The Damsels led 21-13 at the break.

Also hitting double figures for Glendale was Corson with 12. In addition to her 19 points, Miles added nine rebounds. Trisha Martin led Mo Valley with eight

boards.

The Damsels won the junior varsity game 23-11. Allison Gmerek and Megan Washell led Mo Valley with six points each. Crystal Killion tallied four to lead Glendale.
