2001-2002 Season Under second-year head coach McQuown, Lady Vikes gunning for MVL title

FLINTON — After taking over the Glendale girls' basketball squad last season, head coach Renee McQuown took the team to a 6-18 record.

This year, McQuown hopes to be more competitive in both the Moshannon Valley League and the Juniata Valley League.

To do that she will look to her five letter winners, seniors Amanda Corson, Jean Kaufman and Jill Miles and sophomores Kaytee Gates and Ashley O'Shell.

All five players enjoyed playing time last year, with all three seniors starting for the Lady Vikes.

"It's a nice strong group," said McQuown. "I am looking for those three seniors to give the leadership on the court."

This season Glendale has just 10 players on its roster, making a junior varsity team impossible, something quite different than last season when the Lady Vikes had 17 players.

Many of the ten freshmen that played last season didn't return and the Lady Vikes lost two starters, Nikki and Kristin Keith to graduation.

Miles, the Lady Vikes leading scorer last season with 483 points, needs just 76 points to become the second 1,000-point scorer in three years.

"Jill is just a leader in every aspect — scoring, support, rebounding — you name it she has been there. Jill has been our leading scorer and she will probably continue that this year."

The second-year head coach is also impressed with Corson and Kaufman as well.

"Amanda has really worked

hard this year," McQuown said. "And her shot has really come along. Jean is a powerhouse on the court even though she is so little."

Although McQuown's three seniors are definite starters, the last two spots are up in the air right now.

"We have four sophomores that truthfully I don't know which one will start," McQuown stated. "Just because they all have been showing themselves in practice and they all have a chance." All the girls will get to play, however, and most will see significant time in order to give the five starters a rest.

"We are going to use all of our capabilities this year and give the starting five girls a rest, because they deserve it," McQuown said. "The last couple of years they haven't been able to have a rest because we haven't had a bench. This year we have that capability."

And the Lady Vikings also

have the capability to contend for the Moshannon Valley League crown. But to do that Glendale will have to work as a team, something that has become a main goal of the girls and their coach this season.

"We have some goals," stated McQuown. "We are really stressing a team concept. We worked on that over the summer. The games that we won they worked as a team, the ones we lost we didn't. They have really come a long that way. I think that you are going to see a different team than you have in the past couple of years."

Glendale will open up its season on Nov. 30 at the Cambria Heights Tip-Off Tournament against Ligonier Valley.

AMESVILLE -- The Moshannon Valley girls' basketball team shot just 7-of-14 from the foul line all night, but when it came down to needing the shots to win its game against Moshannon Valley League rival Glendale, the Damsels delivered.

"She gave us some nice three-pointers and some nice passes when we needed it," McQuown said of Corson. "She never gave up. On defense she literally shut Omo down. She kept the girls charged up. She has really stepped up the last couple of games."

O'Shell drained her first trey of the game with less than two minutes to play to bring the score to 35-31.

A basket by Holencik on the rebound put Mo Valley up 36-31, but Miles took the ball down the court and in for two while being fouled. Miles hit the free throw to bring the Lady Vikes within two points with the score at 36-34.

Miles was again fouled with just under a minute to play in the game, but converted on just one of her two allotted shots to bring the score to 36-35.
