2006-2007 Season Glendale girls ready for 2006-0 season

FLINTON - After winning a Moshannon Valley League title and making a trip to the District 6 Class A playoffs last year, the Glendale girls basketball team finds itself in a much different predicament this season.

Last season, head coach John Matchock returned his entire starting five from the previous year. This year, Matchock will have to groom a whole new starting five after losing his top five scorers from last season.

"We lost all of the starters from last year to graduation," Matchock said. "I kind of put my eggs all in one basket last year, so the only time a lot of these girls got to play last year was when we were up by a lot or we were down by a lot. So, varsity experience-wise we aren't very deep right now. But the girls have been working hard in practice, so we are taking it game by game."

Only four returnees from last's year 12-13 team have seen some Seniors experience. game Katee Brittany Boulton, Budzinski, and juniors Cate Dick and Tiffany Twigg all came off the bench last season. Twigg played in all but one game last season as a reserve, while Budzinski is the lone player back to average over a point per game at 1.7 ppg.

But just because they have the most experience doesn't mean they are guaranteed starters. As in years past, Matchock will wait to name a starting five after the girls have had some time to showcase their talents on the practice court.

"I don't have a starting five,

he said. "I don't even have a starting one yet. I like to give them something to shoot for, plus no one has really stood out to me right now. No one has impressed me enough to say they are starting. Everyone has a chance to start this year, freshmen all the way up to the seniors."

The Lady Vikings have five

seniors on the roster this year, along with three juniors. All have seen significant time on the junior varsity level, but will have to step it up a notch to compete at the varsity level.

Still, Matchock sees one improvement from last year's squad - height. Aside from leading scorer and rebounder Ashlee McQuown, the Lady Vikings didn't have that height they needed to compete with some of the bigger teams in both the Juniata Valley League and Moshannon Valley League.

"Our height is really going to be key for us this year," Matchock said. "We have at least four girls that are 5-10 or above.

so that's really going to help us with our rebounding. We lost some of that speed from last year, but I think we gained a lot more with our height. We are just going to have to be smart with the basketball."

While the Lady Vikings have height on their side, Matchock is concerned that turnovers could pose a problem when the regular season kicks into gear. To try and avoid that, he and his assistants have been trying to help the girls make some better decisions when handling the ball.

"We need to work on our turnovers," said Matchock. "We played all summer and turnovers is what has killed us. We don't

have the speed this year, so we have to be smart with the basketball. We have to know when to shoot and when to pass. The girls can shoot, but when it comes to when to shoot, we haven't been making very good decisions. We have been working on that in practice, though."

With just 14 players on the roster, the Lady Vikings will have to buckle down and play smart if they want to repeat as Moshannon Valley League champs, something they have set as a goal this season.

"Our goal is to go back to playoffs again," Matchock said.

"Just to have the atmosphere in the school and at practice leading up to the playoffs, you could tell it was time to get serious and that was kind of fun. This year, I want to go back to the playoffs, and we want try and win another Mo Valley League title. But we are just going to take it game by game this year and see what happens.'

The Lady Vikings open up their season on Dec. 1 at the Branch Tip-Off West Tournament. Glendale plays Austin in the opening game at 6 p.m.

Glendale won the tournament last year, topping host West Branch in the championship game, 49-33. The Lady Vikings went on to finish the season at 12-13 and undefeated in the Moshannon Vallev League.

ALLPORT - The season didn't start off nearly as well as the Glendale girls basketball team wanted it to on Friday evening at the West Branch Tip-Off Tournament.

The Lady Vikings fell behind Austin, 17-0, in the first quarter en route to a 64-41 loss in the opening game of the same tour-nament Glendale was crowned champs at last season.

"We started off slow," said Lady Vikings head coach John Matchock. "We got ourselves in a big hole. Once you do that, it's hard to get yourself out of it. We got open looks, but nothing fell in for us. We couldn't stand under-neath the bastet which we were head the basket, which we were half of the time, and we still couldn't put them in. I don't know if it was first-game jitters or not." The Lady Panthers jumped

out to the 17-0 lead thanks in part from 10 points by Rayna Valenti. Valenti scored a game-

high 27 points in the game. The Lady Vikings finally got on the scoreboard with just under 44 seconds to play in the first quarter when Tara Dick drained a three-pointer.

But, Glendale continued to struggle with the quickness of the Lady Panthers, looking sluggish early.

"I don't know what it is," Matchock said of his girls looking tired early in the game. "I don't know if we are out of shape or what. That's something we or what, that's something we are going to have to work on. I knew coming in tonight that it was going to be a problem. I just didn't know it was going to be that big of a problem. We just didn't get anything on defense. Austin got the rebound, and they were down the court before our

girls turned around half of the time. We just didn't hustle down the court. So, that's something we have work on."

Austin took a 19-5 lead at the end of the first quarter and headed into the locker room with a comfortable 31-15 lead.

Glendale was unable to close the gap, as Valenti and Whitney Crosby scored nine and eight points, respectively in the third quarter, giving the Lady Panthers a 54-25 lead heading into the final frame. The Lady Vikings did

The Lady Vikings did outscore the Lady Panthers in the fourth quarter, 16-10, but by then the gap was too much for

Glendale to close. Tiffany Twigg finished as Glendale's highest scorer with eight points. Austin's Crosby finished with 15, while Casey Boucher added 12.

"Luckily, we get to come back

and play tomorrow," said Matchock. "Hopefully, we will play a lot better tomorrow than we did tonight."

Glendale faces Grier in the consolation game at 6 p.m. today.

Sports Writer FLINTON — The Moshannon Valley girls basketball team entered Wednesday's matchup Glendale looking to with rebound from a disappointing loss at Curwensville.

The Damsels led for three quarters before falling on Monday, but Mo Valley made sure that it wouldn't happen for the second time in as many games.

The Damsels opened up a comfortable lead in the first the Lady quarter against the Lady Vikings, and made it stand up, against 38-29, for their first win of the season.

"We knew our kids just had to get over the hump mentally because they're so used to playing from behind, and, at times, they'd forget that they're ahead," said Mo Valley head coach Tom Tomasko. "We played like we were having to play catch up (on Monday), but hopefully they saw a little bit tonight where they were ahead and they had to be a little more patient and just take the good looks (at the basket).

Mo Valley opened up a seven-point lead thanks to freshman Vanessa Rowley. Rowley opened the scoring by knocking down a three-pointer, before making a pair of layups from fastbreaks for the early cushion.

Rowley finished with game-high 10 points, all of which were scored in the first half.

"We thought if we'd start out in man, with our quickness, that we could get a pretty good start, which, basically we did do," Tomasko said. "Rowley picked up a lot of points there early mostly on steals and fastbreak situations. It gave us quite a bit of cushion for the rest of the game,"

The Damsels kept the pressure on Glendale, forcing eight first-quarter turnovers en route to a 16-6 lead after one.

"It seems like we get in this routine of digging ourselves into this hole," said Lady Vikings head coach John Matchock. "I told them in the locker room that we're not a team, right now, that can dig ourselves out of a hole. We stepped up a little bit, but it was too late."

Neither team got their offenses in gear in the second, as Glendale outscored Mo Valley, 6-5, but still trailed 21-12 heading into halftime.

Tiffany Twigg netted four of her team-high eight points in the second, while teammate Katee Budzinski added the other two.

Rowley had three points in the quarter, while Jordan Cook added the other bucket. Cook finished the game with nine points.

Glendale committed 10 more turnovers in the third, but the Damsels were unable to capitalize on a majority of Lady Viking miscues.

Both teams netted six points in the quarter, and Mo Valley entered the fourth up 27-18.

"All of our passes seemed like they were to Mo Valley

players," Matchock said. "I don't know if Mo Valley was playing good defense, or if we just weren't looking who we were passing to.

"Mo Valley came in and played well. I saw them Monday night against Curwensville, so I knew that they were small, but quick. I knew (their speed) would be a problem, and I was hoping that we'd be able to make our shots underneath and get back on defense. We just didn't do that tonight."

The Damsel offense began the fourth much like it did the first. Mo Valley netted the first seven points of the quarter to open up a 34-18 lead with 6:03 remaining.

Amy Tomasko netted five of the seven, while Staci Godin added a layup to open up the double-digit advantage. Tomasko scored all of her eight points in the fourth.

"It seemed like we struggled offensively after the first quar-ter," said Coach Tomasko, "but sometimes that happens when you have a big first quarter. We knew Glendale would be very competitive and they always are up here. We knew they had a con-

siderable size advantage on us. so we wanted to make sure that we were trying to limit them to one shot.

Twigg netted four more points in the fourth, and Tara Dick added a three-pointer with under five seconds to play to set the final.

"For us to start performing better, I think we have to take better care of the basketball," said Matchock, whose team committed 32 turnovers. "We have too many turnovers, and a lot of them were unforced turnovers — picking up our dribble, getting trapped, throw-ing the ball away or throwing it to one of them. It's just the small things we have to work on, but those small things turn into big things when you keep adding them up."

The Damsels improved to 1-1 on the season and 1-1 in the Moshannon Valley League, while the Lady Vikings dipped to 1-2 and 0-1.

Struble (10 points) got the second half off to a good start for the Lady Tide, entering the game and making an immediate impact. Glendale began the half with possession, but Struble quickly produced a steal and found an open White for a layup.

Struble went on to score eight

points in the third quarter, as Curwensville outscored Glendale 17-11 in the frame to take a 40-29 lead.

"That was a bonus to get Dani playing time at all," said Gearhart. "She came through her surgery (broken nose) really well and got clearance.

"She was really itching to get in, but until we really needed her we didn't want to put her out on the floor. She made a difference out there — she got us a quick steal to start the second half, and she gives you that kind of effort every time out there."

White put the game away in the fourth quarter with five points to cap a stellar night in which the Lady Tide senior made several key plays, including a reverse layup in the third.

"I think that was Jackie's best overall game," said Gearhart. "She had a lot of assists. She found people open, and she passed up a few shots to get the

ball to teammates. She stepped up tonight when we needed her."
