Glendale brings back solid nucleus for 2019-20 season

FLINTON — The Glendale girls basketball team returns four letterwinners from last year's 8-14 squad.

The Lady Vikings, led by second-year head coach Beth Campbell, have had a much easier preseason now that they know what to expect from each other.

"That year has definitely made it easier," Campbell said. "The transition was smoother, but we are still working with junior high coaches to build a cohesive program."

Back for Glendale are senior Madison Lukehart, juniors Olivia Reese and Lilley Vereshack and sophomore Kyla Campbell.

Reese and Campbell were starters on varsity last year, while Lukehart and Vereshack saw a lot of action, and Coach Campbell expects them to step up even more this season.

"I am definitely expecting them to be the leaders of this team," she said. "I have two returning starters in Olivia Reese and Kyla Campbell. They averaged around 30 minutes a game last year so they have a lot more experience going into this year and they both had a good season last year.

"Olivia averaged 10.7 points and 7.8 rebounds a game and was a Mo Valley league and Progressland all-star in her sophomore season. Kyla averaged 11.3 points and 10.7 rebounds. She was a Mo Valley league all-star, a Progressland second team selection and led Progressland in rebounds for her freshman season. They work really well together and having your main ball handlers back is a big advantage."

"Joining them as a returning letterwinner is senior Madison Lukehart. Madison has had a really good preseason and I expect great things from her this year. She is really seeing the floor well and I believe she will get a lot of assists. She has been working on her shooting too and I expect her to be a consistent scorer this year.

"Our final letterwinner is junior Lilley Vereshack. Because of how aggressively she goes to the basket and rebounds, we will be playing Lilley as a small forward. We will be relying on her to guard girls much taller than her and I have no doubt she will do a great job of it. She has a lot of intensity on defense."

Despite the four letterwinners, the Lady Vikings are still a very young team. With six sophomores and five freshmen, Campbell is expecting them to improve as the season goes on.

"We are extremely young and mostly inexperienced," said Coach Campbell. "There are quite a few freshmen and sophomores vying for playing time. The entire freshman class plus sophomore Bailee Wimberly spent a lot of time at open gyms this summer and I am hoping that fact and their continued improvement keeps the other players from getting complacent. I look for these two classes to get a lot of playing time this year."

Coach Campbell has been impressed with the work ethic of her group and is looking forward to the future.

"I am very excited for the future of Glendale girls basketball, these young girls are only going to get better," she said. "This group works very hard. My first year I had three girls come to open gyms, this year we averaged twelve. That hard work shows. They are also very athletic which means we get up and down the floor quickly."

The Lady Vikings will have to fill the holes left by the graduation of starters Molly Mullhollen, Sydney Lumadue and Brooke Smeal.

"Molly was pretty much our enforcer in the paint," Campbell said. "She averaged almost 10 rebounds a game and it may take a combination of girls to replace that. Syd had a really good senior season and ended up being a big three point threat by the end of the year. Not sure yet who will step up and fill that void.

"Brooke was the team leader last year and did a lot of little things that you don't get press. She said the team goals are to play as a team, improve on last year's record and compete in the district tournament.

Campbell is being assisted by Jim Campbell and Taylor Campbell. Jim Haney and Christy Braniff will be running the junior high team.

Glendale begins its season on Dec. 6 vs. Conemaugh Valley at the Blacklick Valley Tip-Off Tournament.

Glendale holds off Williamsburg for title

WILLIAMSBURG — Last season, the Glendale girls basketball team won just eight games, and this season, it almost managed to match that in December alone.

The Lady Vikings (6-2) had to sweat out the Lady Blue Pirate Holiday Tournament championship but survived, winning 59-52 over Williamsburg (3-5) Friday night at Williamsburg Community High School.

“We have quite a few girls on this team who put a lot of time in outside of just regular practices, or the three months of the season,” Glendale coach Beth Campbell. “I think that’s new for Glendale. That means that there’s someone pushing you everyday. You cannot be complacent.”

The first quarter started off more on the defensive side before a Kyla

Campbell 3, and a three-point play from Olivia Reese got the Vikings off to an 9-3 lead.

Williamsburg answered back, though, on a long jumper from Kendel Norris for two of her 11 points and a 3 from Marcella Lynn to make it 18-16 Glendale after the opening stanza.

“(Williamsburg) just never gave up,” Campbell said. “There was a couple of times where we got a little bit of a lead — six, seven points — and you felt like you might get a little bit of breathing room and they just barreled back.”

Campbell, the tourney MVP, ended with a game-high 20 points, and Reese finished with a double-double with 12 points and 10 steals going 8-for-12 from the free-throw line.

Jayla Woodruff led the Lady Pirates with 15 points, while Lynn added 13.

trailing 30-27, Williamsburg looked like it was ready to take over as Krista Simpson knocked down an and-1 for two of her eight points with 7 minutes to go in the quarter and moments later came up with a block.

Madison Lukehart stopped that rally with a 3-ball to give the Lady Vikings a 41-40 lead after the third.

Simpson in the fourth gave the Lady Pirates one last chance, drawing the bonus to cut the deficit down to one.

Lilley Vereshack, though, put the game away with a hook shot to give Glendale what was then a three-point lead.

“(Vereshack, Hanna Noel and Lukehart) have to perform, and they

did today,” Campbell said. “They didn’t turn the ball over, they put it in the hoop when they needed to.”

Williamsburg coach Amy Hileman is confident in her team’s chance to keep improving.

“We were with them the whole entire game, but the start of the fourth quarter we got a little sloppy, started to throw the ball away,” she said. “We’re still getting rattled a little bit when it comes to pressure situations. I told the girls these are all awesome learning experiences that we are being tested early.”

Earlier, Northern Bedford pulled away to win the consolation game over Moshannon Valley, 53-34. Allie Snider led all scorers with 15 points and Madison Johnson chipped in 12. Aubrey Dotts led the Damsels with 13 points while Sydney Bubb added 12.

Bubb, Johnson, Woodruff, Norris and Reese made the all-tourna-

ment team. Casey Kuhn from Glendale took home the sportsmanship award while Simpson was named the defensive player.

Vikings get team victory

FLINTON — Glendale put together a solid all-around effort and reaped its rewards in a first-round District 6 Class 2A girls basketball playoff victory Monday night.

Led by sophomore guard Kyla Campbell's 21 points, the Lady Vikings got double-figure scoring outputs from three different players and staved off pesky Southern Huntingdon, 50-46 in the Glendale Area High School gymnasium.

Glendale (15-3) now gets a quarterfinal-round matchup Wednesday night on the road against two-time defending PIAA Class 2A champion Bellwood-Antis.

"I thought it was one of the better team games we've had," Glendale coach Beth Campbell said of Monday's performance. "Everybody who stepped on the floor for us tonight did their job."

Glendale kept a positive attitude through thick and thin, according to Coach Campbell.

"In the past, it was a little bit of a problem if we made a mistake," Campbell said. "Then we struggled to recover. But tonight, if we made a mistake, we hustled to the other end of the floor and made up for it."

After junior forward Jenny Cantrell, who scored a game-high 28 points for Southern Huntingdon, tied the score at 43-43 with a 3-pointer from the right corner with 2:40 left in the game, Kyla Campbell drained a 3-pointer of her own from the right wing with under a minute left to give Glendale the lead for good, 46-43.

Kyla Campbell followed with a pair of free throws moments later to put the Lady Vikings ahead, 48-43.

Southern Huntingdon rallied to within 48-46 with 15 seconds left on Cantrell's jumper from the right corner just seconds after a free throw by freshman Majerle North.

Glendale sewed up the victory when junior Olivia Reese, who was fouled after grabbing an inbounds pass, hit both free throws with six seconds left to give the Lady Vikings a 50-46 lead and make it a two-possession game.

"I think this was a really good win," Kyla Campbell said. "We had a really good team game. Everybody worked together and hit good shots."

Reese and sophomore Hanna Noel both scored 10 points for Glendale, while junior Lilley Vereshack, who drew praise from Coach Campbell, added nine points.

"I thought that was Lilley's best game of the season tonight," Coach Campbell said. "She was a sparkplug for us. She caused the opposing team to get into a lot of foul trouble. She was a presence everywhere."

The game was nip-and-tuck throughout, as Southern Huntingdon, which starts four freshmen, played Glendale to a 26-26 tie at intermission.

Southern, which finished the season with an 11-11 record, has been playing without its veteran head coach, Phil Speck, for the past six weeks. Speck is hospitalized and is battling an aggressive form of cancer.

Assistant coach Ramonda Zinobile has been the acting head coach in Speck's absence.

Zinobile felt that the young Southern Huntingdon team may have been dealing with a case of butterflies in Monday's playoff opener.

"I feel like we played a little panicked," Zinobile said. "We were rushing things. We're a very young team, with four freshmen starters who were playing in a playoff game for the first time, and I think nerves were involved tonight."

"This team has a bright future ahead of it," Zinobile said. "They just need to

clean up some of the little things."

Beth Campbell saluted the Southern Huntingdon team for playing well under the strain of concern for its head coach.

"We're praying for their coach, who is fighting cancer," Beth Campbell said. "He must be a special guy. What a scrappy team they have to come out and play under that type of adversity."

Glendale carried the third quarter, 12-6, to take a 38-32 lead into the fourth quarter, before Southern Huntingdon battled back.

Kyla Campbell and Reese collected nine rebounds apiece for Glendale, while Cantrell had 10 to lead Southern Huntingdon.

"In the third and fourth quarters, we rebounded well," Beth Campbell said. "Cantrell is a really nice player. We did a better job of keeping her off the boards in

the second half, and it made a difference for us."

Glendale draws the state's best Class 2A girls team in Bellwood-Antis in the quarterfinals. Bellwood won two regular-season meetings with Glendale quite handily.

"They're a great team," Coach Campbell said of Bellwood-Antis. "The best that we can do is to prepare and encourage our girls to work as hard as they can, and to go out and do their best and see what happens."

Glendale went 8-0 in the Moshannon Valley League to win it for the first time since the 2010-11 campaign, which was also the last time the Lady Vikings won 15 games (they were 16-7 that season). Glendale also won a playoff game for the first time since the 1998-99 season when it beat Portage. The Lady Vikings led Progressland in points per game (48.8), free throw percentage (61.9) and 3-pointers per game (4.0).

First Team: Olivia Reese, Junior, Glendale: A Progressland first-teamer as a sophomore, Reese exceeded her numbers across the board as she helped the Lady Vikings record their best season in nearly a decade. Reese scored in double figures in 19 of Glendale's 24 games on the way to a 12.38 points per game average, which trailed just Hauser and Campbell. Reese, who was named the Moshannon Valley League MVP, led the area in steals with 4.75 per game and was third in assists at 2.38 per contest. She was also fifth in blocked shots (1.5) and sixth in rebounds (7.7). With one season left to play, Reese has 705 points for her career.
