

FLINTON — After falling to
West Branch on Monday, the
Glendale volleyball team looked to rebound on Wednesday, host-ing Claysburg-Kimmel, but fell in four sets 25-19, 25-21, 24-26 and 25-17 to the Lady Bulldogs.

Glendale started out slowly in the first two sets and was unable to recover, falling behind

two sets to none.

'It just seemed like we were waiting for something to happen," said Glendale head coach Melissa Poole, "And I keep telling them that they can't wait around for things to happen, and that they have to make things happen.

Glendale fell behind early in the first set, 6-1, but pulled to within 7-5, behind the serving of junior Kayla Miles. Miles finished the night with 10 service points and two aces.

"I haven't lost confidence in C.J. (Krise)," Poole said, "but she's having a little problem with her serve. Kayla has stepped up in practice and has a

good attitude all the time, whether she's playing or not. She's deserved a chance to see some varsity time and, as long as she's getting aces, I'm going to keep having her serve." Although Miles kept the Lady

Vikings around early, the serving of the Lady Bulldogs proved to be too much in the end, and Claysburg came away with a 25-19 win in the set.

Glendale took an 11-6 advantage early in the second set behind two more service points from Miles and three kills from Ashlee McQuown.

Vikings were The Lady unable to maintain the momentum after leading 19-18 late in the set, and saw the Lady Bulldogs claw back to win the set 25-21.

"Ashlee McQuown was up there getting kills and blocks," Poole said, "And Michelle (Peoples) was getting aces and all of a sudden, we wanted to play. We can't wait around...we have to want to play in game one."

The third set was more of

what Poole expected of her squad. Miles registered five more service points and McQuown came up with three blocks in the set. Ashley Queen and Jenna Miles also had multiple kills in the set. Miles finished the evening with nine

The biggest boost, however, came from Peoples. The Lady Viking senior found her squad trailing 24-19 and proceeded to serve seven straight points to give Glendale a dramatic come-from-behind win in the set. Peoples finished the set with 10 service points, and had 14 in all, including four aces.
"I had goose bumps for about

three minutes after she served the winning point," said Poole. "She served seven right in a row. We can't afford to sit back on our heels though. We have to make things happen."

Glendale had gained some much-needed momentum from the win, and jumped on Claysburg early in the fourth game.

McQuown registered three

quick kills to push her team ahead 11-7. The Lady Viking senior registered 15 kills on the night to go along with four blocks.

The momentum shifted to Claysburg after an inbounds call went against Glendale and the Lady Bulldogs retained their serve, which continue to give the Lady Vikings problems.
"Some of the calls were one

thing, but we can't let officials control what we do on the court," Poole said. "It was a factor, but it shouldn't have cost us the game. Our serve-receive wasn't good and they had a cou-ple of times when they served four or five in a row."

Claysburg capitalized and went on to win the set 25-17 and the match.

Glendale fell to 2-4 on the season with the loss.

The Lady Viking junior varsity team won in straight sets 25-21 and 25-7 to improve to 2-4 on
