MOUNT UNION — The Glendale Lady Vikings were handed a 3-0 loss Tuesday at Mount Union, 25-6, 25-14, 25-7 in their opening volleyball match.

Sophomore Tiffany Horon also enjoyed a solid night, recording 15 digs, while teammate Whitney Strong chipped in with four kills. Kayla Miles had seven assists on the night.

In junior varsity action, Glendale lost to the Lady Trojans 25-9, 25-11.

FLINTON — Moshannon Valley volleyball coach Jamie Washell used the Jen Marcinko Memorial Tournament in Philipsburg on Sept. 2 to see what players she wanted on the court when the regular season started.

The Damsels haven't played a match since, but Washell had the squad she wanted on the court for Monday's match with Glendale.

Mo Valley defeated the Lady Vikings in straight sets, 25-11, 25-17 and 25-21.

"I did a lot of subbing during tournament play because I wanted to see who I needed (on the court)," said Washell. "I thought we did a real good job of playing as a unit. I thought we really pulled together well."

The Damsels cruised through the first two sets before Glendale gave them a run in the third.

The two teams battled back and forth throughout much of the set, before the Damsels' serving was able to put the Lady Vikings away for the sweep.

"We can't lose 25-11 and then come back two sets later and decide that we want to play," Glendale head coach Melissa Poole said. "They have to learn that the match starts at 0-0 in game one."

In the first set, three straight aces by the Damsels' Cydnee Sankey put Mo Valley up 6-3 before teammate Ashley Thompson had two service points of her own to put their team up 9-5.

The Damsels, in all, had 17 service points in the first set, including six in a row by Sara Zakutney, who finished tied with a team-high 12 service points.

"That was the key tonight," said Washell. "I think serving just played a big part in this win. It was pretty loud in here tonight and I think there was a little bit of a noise factor, which I expect-

ed. A lot of the time our right side couldn't hear the call, but we were still able to get to the ball when we needed to."

"We had a lot of communication errors," Poole said. "There was a lot of looking around, looking at the girl, and then going for the ball. We have to eliminate that. It's nothing new to them because they do it in practice.

We just have to use that when we got on the court and when it counts."

The Lady Vikings gave Mo Valley trouble early in the second set, trailing 16-14, thanks to a pair of service points from Ashley Queen and three from Jenna Miles.

Miles led the Lady Vikings with eight kills, while Queen registered six.

Glendale cut it to 20-17 before Amy Tomasko registered a kill, then reeled off five straight service points to give the Damsels a 2-0 lead in the match.

Tomasko also had 12 service points, including four aces.

"I think we're still trying to find our confidence," said Poole. "We can do a lot better than we're playing right now, and tonight we just waited until game three to start to play."

The third set was similar to the second, with both teams battling back and forth throughout.

Krystal Edmiston recorded four service points in the set, but, ultimately, it was the Damsels' serving ability that sealed the set and the match.

Trailing 21-18, Zakutney put her team on top with five more of her 12 service points, before teammate Molly Brady sealed the win with a serve that Glendale couldn't return.

"We had good passing and good communication," Washell said. "I was just happy overall with how everything went tonight. I thought we handled the ball well — there weren't any carries and there were only a couple of nets. We just need to get more hitting, but what team doesn't want more hitting?"

Mo Valley is 1-0 on the young season, while Glendale dropped

to 0-2.

"It's something to build on," said Poole of her squad's effort in the final set. "They left knowing that they played well in the last set, but they just can't forget about the first and second (sets). They have to decide to do it from

the beginning, and not just after a big play then decide they want to do it."

Both teams take to the road Wednesday, with the Damsels traveling to Williamsburg and the Lady Vikings heading to West Branch.
