1. Approval of 2/14/13 Minutes

A.

1) Last months minutes were reviewed and opened for discussion

**Motion:** Approve above referenced minutes

Seconded and approved unanimously

- 2. Reports of Committee Chairpersons
  - **A.** Discussion and vote for the items requested as follows:
    - 1) Girls Lacrosse 2 nets = \$702.35
    - 2) Compensation for Assistant Track Coach = \$1000.00
    - 3) Finish line time clock/measure = \$425.00

**Motion:** To approve above requests

- **B**. Generator request from Softball Coach, but will benefit all sports teams:
  - 1) Discussion of information gathered by Ken Taber regarding the Yamaha Generator vs multiple other generators

#### Yamaha

- a. Inverter = cleaner power and 1000 watts
- b. Top of the line and quiet
- c. Weighs 30 lb.
- d. \$895.00

#### Generac

- a. Inverter with 2000 watts
- b. Weighs 50 lb.
- c. \$695

# Honeywell

- a. Inverter with 2000 watts
- b. \$525.00
- 2) Discussion: Ken Fowler suggested to gather more information regarding amperage and other specifications to ensure that the item could be used to the fullest capability by multiple teams simultaneously

**Motion:** Table the item in order to obtain more information before a final vote is taken, which would be via email

3) Additional Discussion: Paul Bohannon also discussed the idea of a waterproof 110 volt outlet at the athletic storage shed to be used in conjunction with the generator for simultaneous team use. The cost would be \$225.00 approximately.

# **Motion:**

Request for purchase of Yamaha Generator @ 895.00 for all teams.

### **New Motion:**

Research above mentioned generators further with a \$950.00 ceiling, which would include taxes and the wired waterproof outlet to be used in conjunction with generator to utilize as many fields as possible simultaneously.

- C. Year Round Concession and Memorial Day Weekend
  - 1) Frank DeStefano discussed the opportunities available year round that could have a positive impact on the Booster Club. He noted that over the Martin Luther King, Jr holiday weekend there were 4 games in the gym and no concessions. He suggested a year round master calendar could be obtained from Keith Kenyon and each season a rotation of concession volunteers could be scheduled which would possibly alleviate burnout of the same volunteers and could increase revenue for all the seasons. Further discussion involved how to create incentive so that the student athletes and their parents would become more involved.

**Action:** Table discussion for next meeting, but be thinking of ideas on how to use these extra opportunities.
